### 1/ REGIN indicators - Why?

Need for an analytical tool to evaluate the regional governance of integration, based on empirical evidence

- Institutional recognition at EU level → 2019-2022, AMIF funded projects
  - Key role of regions in migrant and refugee integration
  - Need for a common frame of evaluation and planification → REGIN
- Academic interest → fill in a "gap" in the literature
  - Indicators at national level: MIPEX, NIEM
  - Indicators at city level: Intercultural Cities Index
  - Regional:



### 2/ MIPEX-R: What is and how does it work?

- 1st EU system of indicators for regional governance of integration (0-100 scale)
- Governance "quality" = development & capacity to ensure migrant equality

- Elements: Actions; Actors & relations; Resources
- Phases: Formulation; Issuing (Policy output); Implementation; Evaluation
- Target-populations: TCNs; BIPs (Asylum seekers and refugees)
- Policy-focus: Main integration areas (health, housing, labour market, etc.)

- 61 indicators (scores) → evaluation of governance
  - ✓ Strengths and Weaknesses
  - ✓ Key challenges and good practices
  - ✓ More and less developed parts (e.g., gaps)



### 3/ MIPEX-R: What is and what does it measure?

• 25 European regions including 6 REGIN partner-regions (at 31.03.2020):

#### Gaps - e.g.:

- 1: Inclusion of migrants' voice
- 2: Diversification of resources
- 3: Monitoring mechanisms

#### Best practices - e.g.,

- Catalonia language policies
- Skåne's social assistance
