ISSUE

Ensuring the effectiveness and sustainability of regional integration actions

1. Build-up the integration

- *Regional Unitary Programming/Migrants' Policy*
- *Commitment: 1) Com.In.4.0; 2) Agreement Mint/Campania*

2. Selecting a practical strategy

- *Internal Areas National Strategy*
- *Identify favourable contexts*

4. search for innovative solutions

- To identify at the bottom which activities, how and who implement them
- To integrate local communities

5. SWOT for success keys

- Strengths: STRIM
- Weaknesses: lack of HR
- Opportunities: PNRR/CP
- Threats: Time
